INITIAL EMT CERTIFICATION CHECKLIST

PROCESSING - You must apply in person
AGE REQUIREMENT - Must be 18 years of age or older
APPLICATION - Completed EMT certification application form (Signed and Dated)
EMT TRAINING - Original and copy of EMT course completion (APPLICATION MUST BE MADE WITHIN TWO (2) YEARS OF BEING ISSUED AN EMT COURSE COMPLETION RECORD)
NR EMT CARD - Original and copy (front and back) of current National Registry EMT Card
NR EMT CERT - Original and copy of National Registry EMT Certificate
CPR CARD - Original and copy (front and back) of current cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) card issued by the American Heart Association (AHA) – Healthcare Provider, American Red Cross – CPR/AED for Professional Rescuers and Health Care Providers, or Imperial County EMS Agency approved equivalent. Online programs are not acceptable
VALID ID - Original and copy of valid driver's license, identification, federal issued passport, or other Imperial County EMS Agency approved form of identification
PAYMENT OF FEES – Non-refundable EMT Certification Fee - \$85.00; Cash, cashier's checks (Make checks payable to Imperial County Public Health Department), money orders, credit and debit Cards are accepted. DO NOT MAIL CASH
DOJ LIVESCAN - Must provide proof of request for a California Department of Justice (DOJ) Live Scan and Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) criminal background check (separate from any other agency requirement)
APPOINTMENT DATE – Report to Window B. Should you arrive 15 minutes (or later) after your scheduled appointment time, your appointment will be cancelled and you will need reschedule.

Upon completion of above requirements and confirmation that the applicant is not precluded from certification for reasons defined in Section 1798.200 of the California Health and Safety Code, the EMS Agency has up to 14 days to issue your EMT Card. The expiration date shall be the last day of the month two (2) years from the effective date of the initial certification, or the expiration date of the certificate or license used to establish eligibility under the California Code of Regulations.
