What is *Aedes aegypti*?

Aedes aegypti are small, black-and-white striped mosquitoes that are not native to California. They were recently detected for the first time in Imperial County through the Public Health Department's active surveillance program. *Aedes aegypti* mosquitoes are the main carriers of exotic mosquito-borne viruses such as dengue, chikungunya and yellow fever and spread diseases by biting humans.

Aedes aegypti son pequeños mosquitos, de rayas blanco con negro que no son nativos de California.
