Local Public Health System Assessment

The Local Public Health System Assessment uses a survey tool from the National Public Health Performance Standards Program. The survey tool was completed by local public health system stakeholders, including the Imperial County Community Health Assessment & Improvement Plan Steering Committee, Imperial County Public Health Department staff and other community partners. The primary purpose of the assessment is to promote continuous improvement that will result in positive outcomes for local public health system performance.

Ten Essential Public Health Services

The Ten Essential Public Health Services provide a working definition of public health and a guiding framework for the responsibilities of local public health systems. They were developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Core Public Health Functions Steering Committee in 1994. The Local Public Health System Assessment asks questions about how a community provides each essential using a series of "model standards" for each service. There are thirty model standards evaluated with a series of questions for each standard.




Scoring

LPHS stakeholders responded to the assessment questions using the following response options below. For each question, the participants asked "How well are we doing this activity in our local public health system?"

Optimal Activity	Greater than 75% of the activity described within the question is met.
Significant Activity	Greater than 50% but no more than 75% of the activity described within the question is met
Moderate Activity	Greater than 25% but no more than 50% of the activity described within the question is met
Minimal Activity	Greater than zero but no more than 25% of the activity described within the question is met.
No Activity	0% or absolutely no activity.


Overall Scores for Each Essential Public Health Service
