

# Heat-Related Illness Summary for 2009

A total of 105 heat-related illnesses were reported by Imperial County hospitals during 2009. The number of heat stroke cases doubled from last year's cases for a total of 26 cases. Of all reported cases, the median age is 41 years (range: 10 to 88 years); 82% are male.

Environmental hyperthermia was responsible for a total of eight deaths this summer. Of the eight deaths, four were undocumented immigrants from Mexico.
