

# Heat-Related Illness Surveillance 2011 Ends

Surveillance for heat-related illnesses and deaths ended October 1, 2011. This summer a total of 67 heat-related illnesses have been reported by local hospitals. The median age of cases is 43 years (range: <1 to 85 years). This is lower than 99 cases reported in 2010, although the number of heat stroke cases were slightly higher than last year with a total of 19 cases.

Environmental hyperthermia was responsible for a total of five deaths in Imperial County this summer. All victims were male, aged 19-50 years, and undocumented immigrants.
