

Heat-Related Illness Surveillance 2012 Ends

Surveillance for heat-related illnesses and deaths ended September 30, 2012. This summer a total of 147 heat-related illnesses and 8 deaths have been reported by local hospitals and coroner's office. This is a significant increase in heat-related illness and deaths compared to 2011's summer season.

Of the 155 reported heat-related cases, 70% were men. The median age was 43 years old with a range of 1 to 95 years of age. Of the reported deaths, 63% of the victims were men, five of the victims were undocumented immigrants found in the desert, two lived in households without utilities, and one was a transient living outside.
