





# **COVID-19 Vaccine** Imperial County Transition Phase

March 8<sup>th</sup>: Enrolled vaccine providers vaccinate 65+ and all in eligible sectors, except K-12 education

Phase 1A: Tiers 1-3 Phase 1B: 65+, Tier 1

K-12 education sector: 10% of allocation set aside.
Working directly with Imperial County Office of Education.

MyTurn: some local providers onboarded

March 15<sup>th</sup>: MyTurn-linked clinics at ICPHD. Other providers onboarded.

Phase 1A: Tiers 1-3 & 1B: 65+, Tier 1 16-64 yrs. w/severe health conditions

<u>16-64 years old - Vaccinating those at higher risk:</u> Beginning March 15, vaccination will be made available to those with certain health conditions, disabilities, illness, living spaces, or work environments that put them at higher risk for serious COVID-19 illness.

Individuals with these conditions are strongly encouraged to seek vaccination with a primary health care provider or system, or in an alternate clinical setting. Check first with your usual health care provider.

Health conditions: At that time, healthcare providers may use their clinical judgement to vaccinate individuals aged 16-64 who are deemed to be at the very highest risk to get very sick from COVID-19 because they have the following severe health conditions: Cancer, current with weakened immune system; Chronic kidney disease, stage 4 or above; Chronic pulmonary disease, oxygen dependent; Down syndrome; Solid organ transplant, leading to a weakened immune system; Pregnancy; Sickle cell disease; Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, or cardiomyopathies (but not hypertension); Severe obesity (Body Mass Index ≥ 40 kg/m²); Type 2 diabetes mellitus with hemoglobin A1c level greater than 7.5%; Disabilities or illness

Healthcare providers may then also vaccinate individuals with developmental or other severe disabilities or illness if: a) The individual is likely to develop severe life-threatening illness or death from COVID-19 infection b) Acquiring COVID-19 will limit the individual's ability to receive ongoing care or services vital to their well-being and survival; c) Providing adequate and timely COVID care will be particularly challenging as a result of the individual's disability.

These include people with a range of physical and behavioral disabilities. Examples include all enrolled consumers of regional centers, independent living centers, in-home supportive services, and community-based adult services/adult day health centers; or those with a Medi-Cal HIV/AIDS waiver, Medi-Cal home, community-based alternatives waiver, or Medi-Cal assisted living waiver.

# COVID-19 vaccination: Find out if it's your turn

Everyone in California will have an opportunity to get vaccinated against COVID-19 at no cost. But our vaccination supply is limited right now. So we're starting with the groups who are at highest risk, like people with a high chance of exposure and people 65 and older.

#### Are you eligible?


Find out if it's your turn by answering a few questions. It only takes a few minutes. If you're eligible and vaccine appointments are available through My Turn, you can schedule one. If it's not your turn yet or appointments are not available, you can register to be notified when you're eligible or when appointments open up.

NOTICE: Due to the high demand and limited supply of COVID-19 vaccines, appointments may take a few weeks to schedule. We are adding more appointments regularly and continue to expand statewide.




