



  - Information includes both existing staffed ICU beds & staffed ICU surge beds. To calculate regional ICU capacity, the total number of adult ICU beds is calculated by removing neonatal ICU beds (NICU) and pediatric intensive care unit beds (PICU), as well as standardizing current adult ICU capacity

## Vaccine Prioritization Phase 1a

During Phase 1a of allocation, COVID-19 vaccine should be offered to the following persons in California:

- 1) Persons at risk of exposure to SARS-CoV-2 through their work in any role in direct health care or long-term care settings.
  - •This population includes persons at direct risk of exposure in their non-clinical roles, such as, but not limited to, environmental services, patient transport, or interpretation.
- 2) Residents of skilled nursing facilities, assisted living facilities, and similar longterm care settings for older or medically vulnerable individuals.

#### **TIER 1 – ONGOING**

- Acute care, psychiatric and correctional facility hospital staff
- Paramedics, EMTs and others providing emergency medical services
- Dialysis center staff
- Staff of residential and inpatient substance use disorder (SUD) treatment and mental health facilities\*
- Skilled nursing facilities, assisted living facilities, and similar settings for older or medically vulnerable individuals (special needs group-living is equivalent to a nursing home or assisted living)\*

#### **TIER 2 – STARTED**

- Staff of intermediate care facilities for persons who need non-continuous nursing supervision and supportive care defined by the Department of Healthcare Services
- Home health care and in-home supportive services staff
- Community health workers, including promotoras(es)
- Public health field staff who conduct field work including but not limited to immunization, communicable disease in-person management, in-person contact investigation and tracing, and in-person COVID testing
- Staff of primary care clinics, including Federally Qualified Health Centers, Rural Health Centers, correctional facility clinics, and urgent care clinics
- Staff of Outpatient SUD treatment and mental health facilities, and crisis stabilization units\*

#### **TIER 3 - HAVEN'T STARTED**

- Other settings and health care workers, including:
  - specialty clinics;
  - laboratory workers;
  - dental and other oral health clinics;
  - pharmacy staff not working in settings at higher tiers
- Mortuary service industry workers\*

## Vaccine Prioritization Phases 1b & 1c

Individuals who have higher risk for severe disease or death (due to age or other factors), who are unable to work at home, who live or work in geographic areas that have been highly impacted, or who are most likely to spread disease to other workers or to the public.

#### Phase 1B - HAVEN'T STARTED

#### **1B - TIER 1:**

- •Individuals 75 and older
- •Those at risk of exposure at work in the following sectors: education, childcare, emergency services, and food and agriculture

#### 1B - TIER 2:


- •Individuals 65 -74 years of age
- •Those at risk of exposure at work in the following sectors: transportation and logistics; industrial, commercial, residential, and sheltering facilities and services; critical manufacturing
- •Congregate settings with outbreak risk: incarcerated and homeless

#### Phase 1C - HAVEN'T STARTED

- Individuals 50 -64 years of age
- People 16-64 years of age and have an underlying health condition or disability which increases their risk of severe COVID-19
- Those at risk of exposure at work in the following sectors: water and wastewater; defense; energy; chemical and hazardous materials; communications and IT; financial services; government operations /community-based essential functions

## **COVID-19 Vaccine Community Survey Results**

5,298

Individuals responded to the survey



74%

Agree that they get vaccinated because **they protect other people** from getting infected



40%

Are confident that the COVID-19 vaccine is safe



42%



Are unsure at this time of the vaccine's safety

58%

Plan to be vaccinated when a COVID-19 vaccine is available, while 28% are unsure if they will get vaccinated



7%

Agree that the COVID-19 disease is NOT serious enough that they need to get vaccinated, while 5% don't know & 14% neither agree or disagree



93%

Have a means of transportation to get to a vaccination site



33%

Prefer to receive the vaccine at a drive-thru clinic, 32% at a doctor's office, 15% at a walk-in clinic close to home, 13% at a pharmacy & 7% at the health department



74%

Prefer a weekday (25% anytime during the day, 17% in the evening, 17% in the morning, & 15% in the afternoon), while 26% prefer to receive their vaccine on a weekend




