



Safely reopening California

Reopening California

California is moving Beyond the Blueprint to safely and fully reopen the economy.

As of June 15, 2021, the Governor terminated the executive orders that put into place the Stay Home Order and the Blueprint for a Safer Economy. He also phased out the vast majority of executive actions put in place since March 2020 as part of the pandemic response, leaving a subset of provisions that facilitate the ongoing recovery.

The new <u>public health order</u> effective June 15 supersedes all prior health orders. The order has limited restrictions, only related to masking and mega-events, as well as settings serving children and youth pending an expected update to the K-12 schools guidance by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Restrictions that ended on June 15 include:






Vaccinations by Zip Code

In the workplace

Cal/OSHA has aligned workplace mask requirements in its <u>COVID-19 Prevention</u> <u>Emergency Temporary Standards</u> (ETS) with <u>mask requirements</u> from the California Department of Public Health:

- •No face covering requirements outdoors (except during outbreaks), regardless of vaccination status, though workers should be trained for outdoor use of face coverings.
- •Employers may allow fully vaccinated employees not to wear face coverings indoors, but must document their vaccination status. There are some settings where masks are required regardless of vaccination status. In outbreaks, all employees must wear face coverings indoors and outdoors when six-feet physical distancing cannot be maintained, regardless of vaccination status.
- •Employers must provide unvaccinated employees with <u>approved</u> respirators for voluntary use when working indoors or in a vehicle with others, upon request.

Changes to Emergency Temporary Standards

Following the June 17 vote by the Occupational Safety and Health Standards Board to adopt the revised COVID-19 Prevention Emergency Temporary Standards, Governor Gavin Newsom signed an <u>executive order</u> to allow the revisions to immediately take effect on June 17. The revised regulations reflect the state's latest COVID-19 public health guidance. The updates include changes to face coverings and physical distancing requirements.
