### I. Purpose:

- 1. To establish the role, duties, and required equipment for EMS personnel to operate in the capacity of a Fireline Emergency Medical Paramedic (FEMP)
- To establish procedures for Fireline Emergency Medical Paramedic (FEMP) within or outside of Imperial County, when requested through the statewide Fire and Rescue Mutual Aid System.

## II. Authority:

- California Emergency Medical Services, Health and Safety Code Division 2.5, Section 1797.204 and 1797.220 and California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Division 9, Chapter 4, Sections 100165, 100167.
- 2. ICS Position Manual (Fireline EMT-P) 223-11

## III. Policy:

- 1. Under the authority of State regulation, a paramedic may render ALS care during emergency operations when the following conditions are met:
  - A. The paramedic is currently licensed by the State of California.
  - B. The paramedic is currently employed with an ALS provider within Imperial County.
  - C. The paramedic is cleared for ALS care in Imperial County by the Imperial County LEMSA.
  - D. The paramedic possesses the necessary wildland skills, certifications, and equipment.
- 2. All FEMPs shall complete the training requirements listed in the current California Incident Command Certification (CICCS) Qualification Guide for Fireline Paramedic.
- 3. FEMPs shall remain under the Imperial County EMS paramedic scope of practice and medical control policies. FEMPs may follow Policy #4020 Base Hospital Contact for communications failure if an immediate life threatening ALS intervention is warranted.
- 4. FEMPs may not perform skills outside of the Imperial County scope of practice.
- 5. All ALS contacts shall be documented per Policy #1500 and shall be submitted to Imperial County EMS for review and QA process.
- 6. All controlled medication shall be obtained, secured, and inventoried as referenced in Policy #4000.
- 7. Minimum ALS inventory required for a Fireline Paramedic is listed later in this policy. This

inventory shall be supplied by the paramedic's home agency.

- 8. Continuous quality assurance and improvement activities shall be in accordance with current Imperial County Policy #1100.
- 9. The EMS provider agency will notify the EMS Agency of the deployment of a FEMP to an incident, notification will include the names of providers deployed and the incident location and name.
- 10. A FEMP will be paired with a Fireline EMT or another FEMP who will assist with patient care and supplies.
