# COVID-19 Updates

- 52,325 cases, 905 deaths
- 5.8 case rate/100K population
- 5.9% positivity rate
- 1,886 variants of concern (697 Omicron, 1,189 Delta)
- No active COVID-19 outbreaks
- 132 hospitalized patients (COVID & non-COVID-19), morning of 3/21/22
  - 6 hospitalized patients with COVID-19, including 3 in ICU
  - 2 available ICU beds
- 94.2% fully vaccinated (ages 5+)

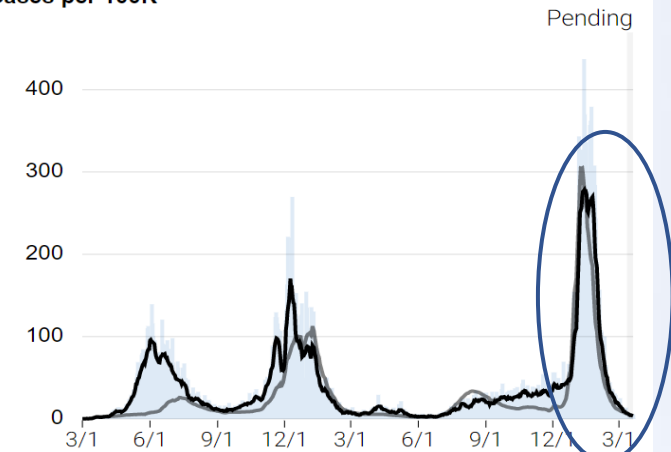

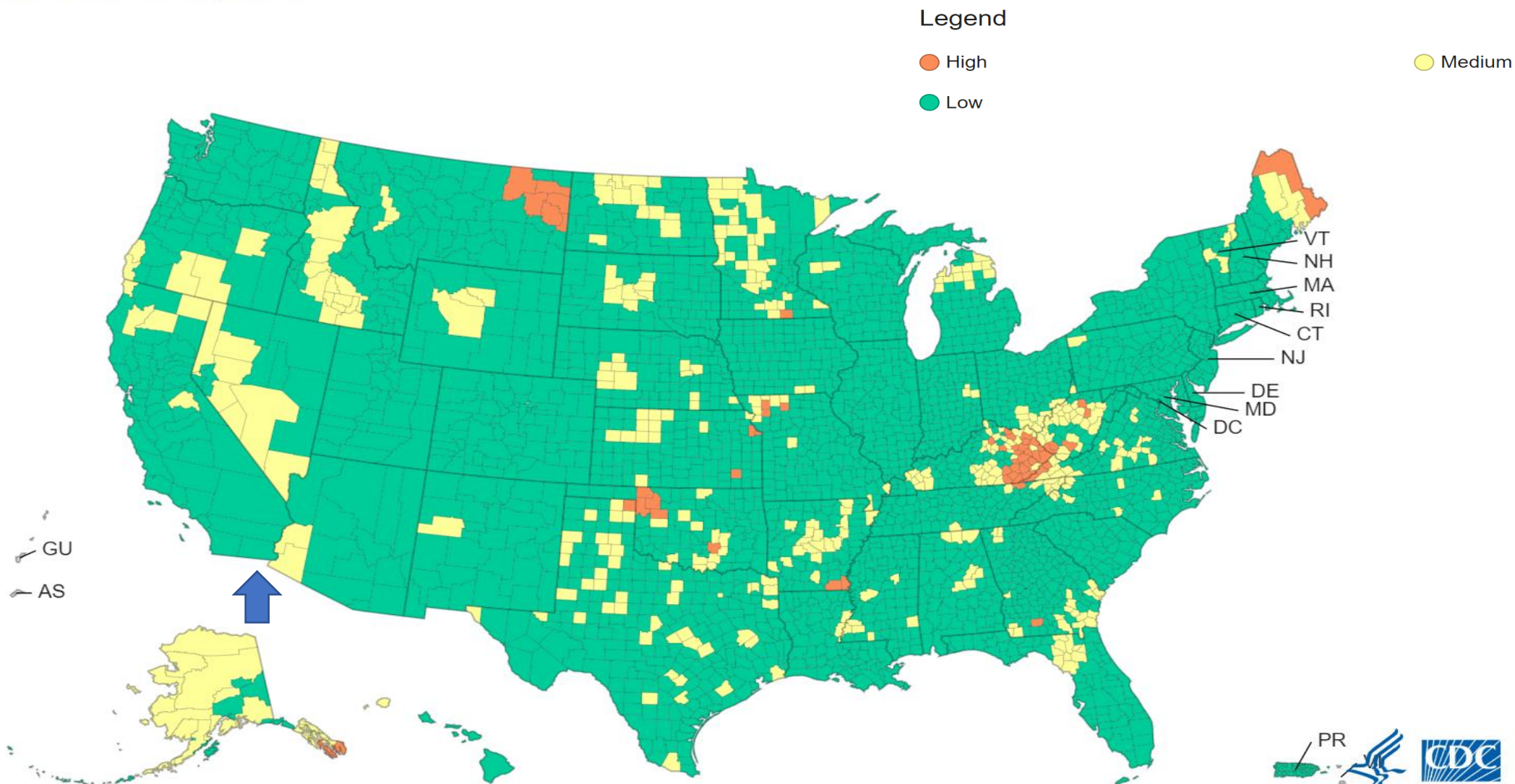

# Mega Events Guidance

Effective April 1, 2022, requirements for vaccine verification or proof of negative test for Indoor [Mega Events](#) will be lifted and move to a strong recommendation

	Restrictions Applying to Indoor & Outdoor Settings
<b>UPDATE:</b> <b>Definitions of Mega Events</b> <a href="#">[1]</a>	Crowds greater than 1,000 (indoors) attendees Crowds greater than 10,000 (outdoors) attendees
<b>Vaccine Verification / Negative Testing</b>	<b>Strongly recommended for Indoor Mega Events</b> Recommended for Outdoor Mega Events
<b>Capacity Limitations</b>	No restrictions
<b>Physical Distancing</b>	No restrictions for attendees, customers, and guests
<b>Masking</b>	Follow current <a href="#">CDPH Guidance for Face Coverings</a> . Refer to <a href="#">CDPH Get the Most Out of Masking</a> for more information on getting the best fit and filtration for your mask
<b>Travelers</b>	Recommend following <a href="#">CDC</a> recommendations for domestic and international travel.

In workplaces, employers are subject to the Cal/OSHA COVID-19 Emergency Temporary Standards (ETS) or in some workplaces the Cal/OSHA Aerosol Transmissible Diseases Standard and should consult those regulations for additional applicable requirements.
