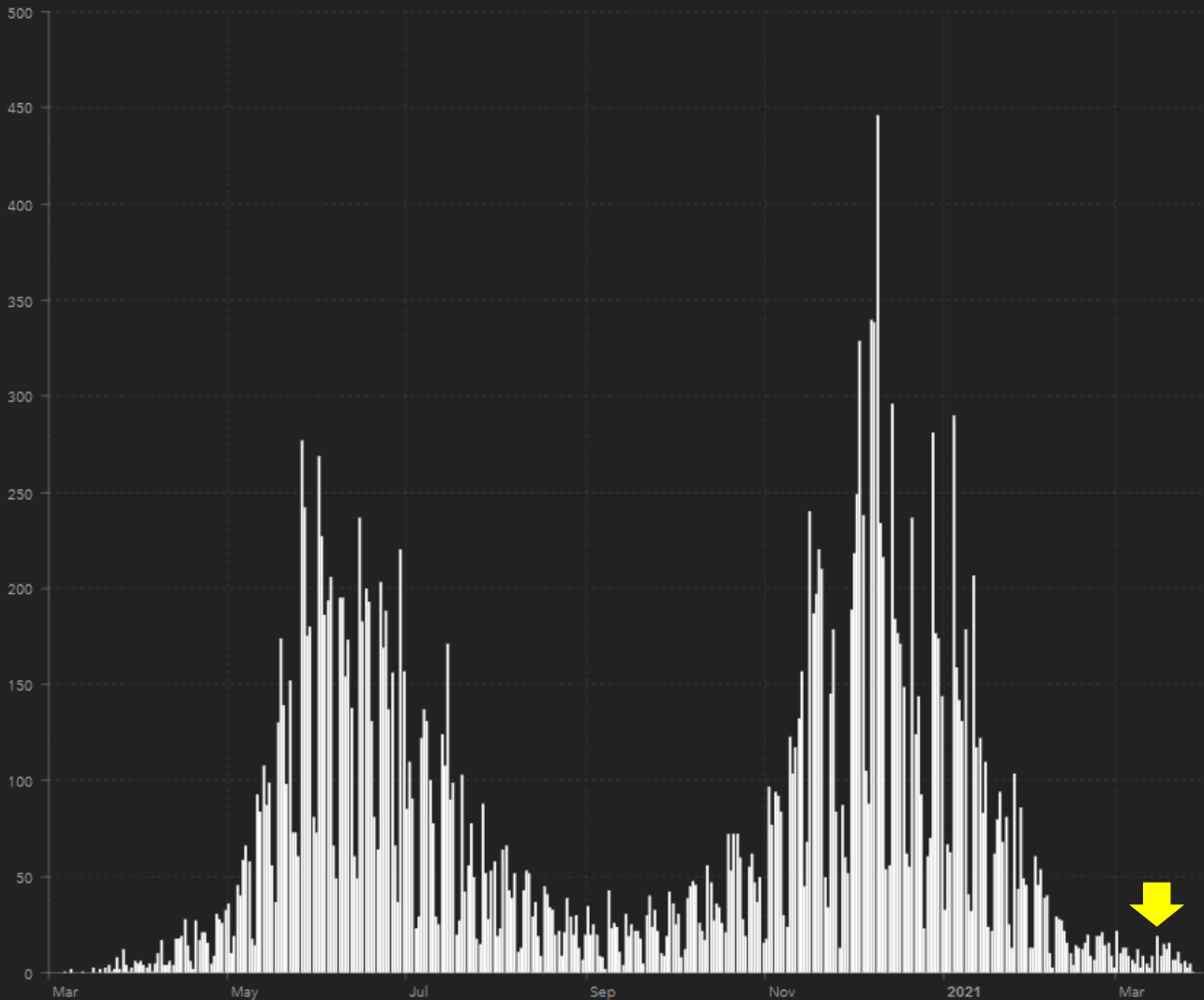

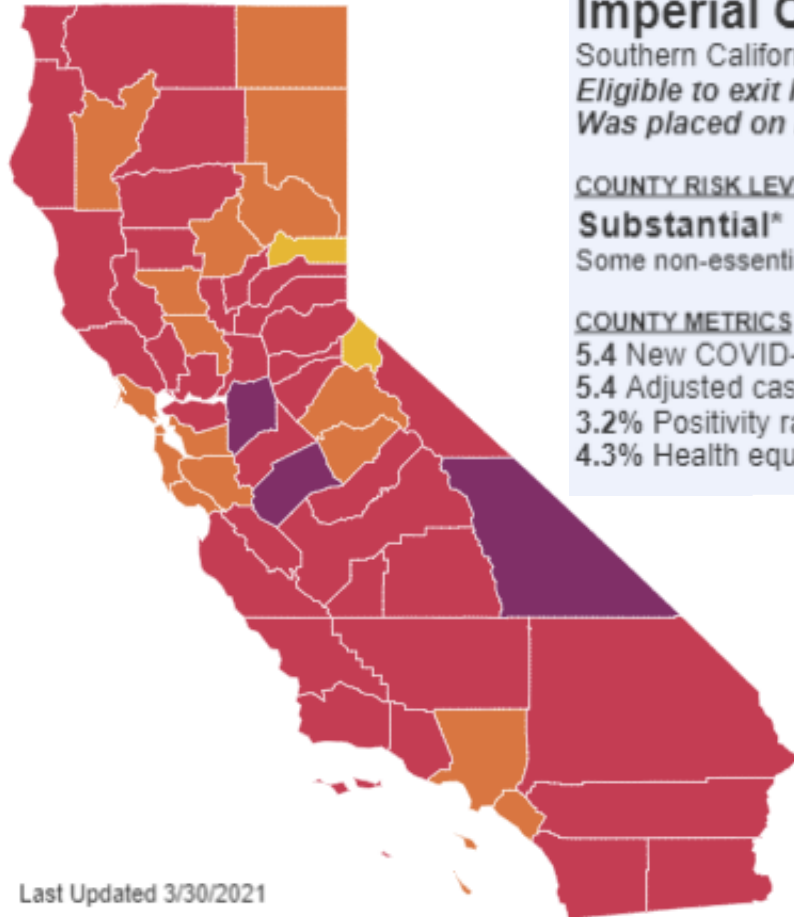

Vaccination is one of the most important tools to end the COVID-19 pandemic. The State will equitably distribute a safe and effective vaccine to everyone in California who wants it. **Californians 50+ will be eligible for vaccination starting April 1. Every Californian 16 and up will be eligible for vaccination on April 15, 2021.**

When you can get vaccinated

California is allocating COVID-19 vaccines as they become available to ensure equitable distribution. Vaccinations are prioritized according to risk and age.

Healthcare workers and long-term care residents (Phase 1A)

Now vaccinating

People with a high chance of exposure and those 65 or older (Phase 1B)

Now vaccinating

Sector populations with high chance of exposure:

- Agriculture and food
- Education and childcare
- Emergency services

Individuals age 16 or older at higher risk

Now vaccinating

People with certain significant high-risk:

- Medical conditions
- Disabilities
- Illnesses
- Living spaces
- Work environments

Individuals 50 or older

Starts April 1, 2021

Every Californian 16 or older

Starts April 15, 2021

Vaccination of people younger than 16 will start as soon as the COVID-19 vaccines are approved for them

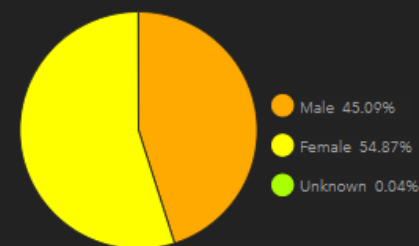

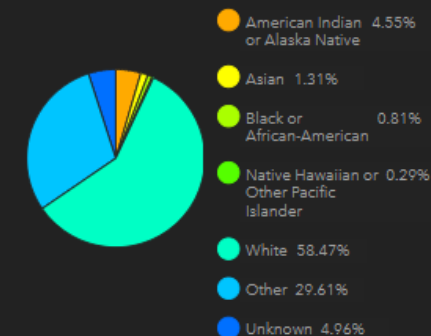
Fully Vaccinated by Age Group



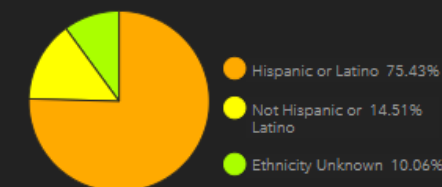
Fully Vaccinated by Gender



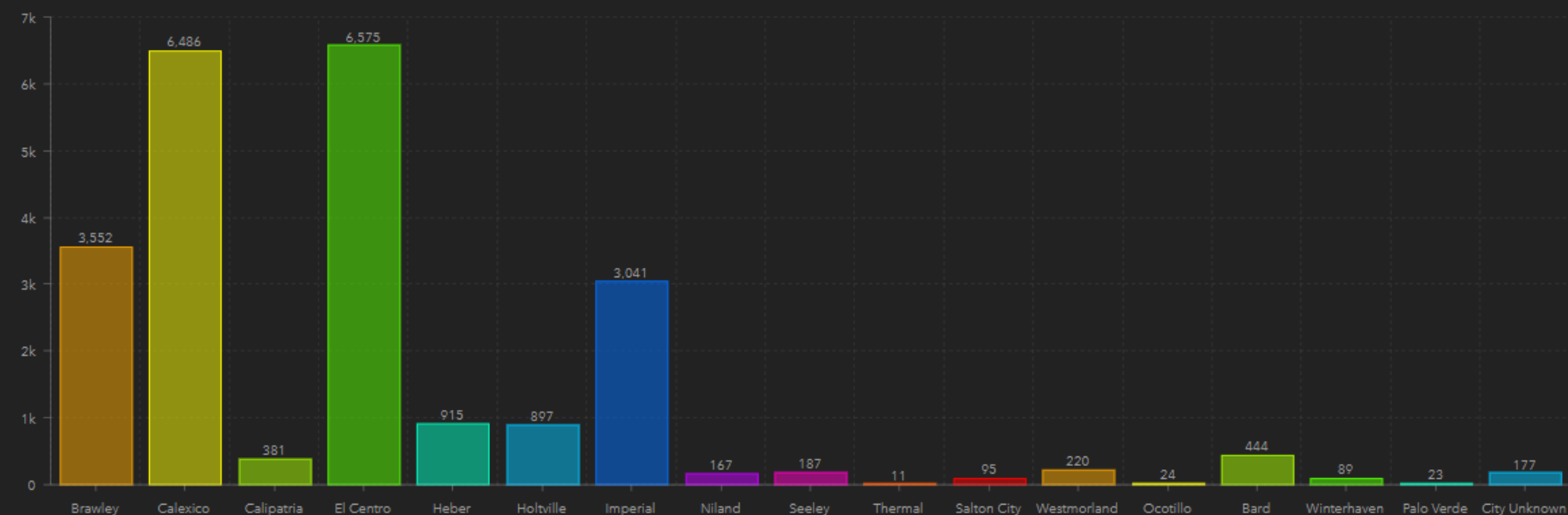
Fully Vaccinated by Race

To ensure our nation's underserved communities and those disproportionately affected by COVID-19 are equitably vaccinated against COVID-19, the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) launched a program to directly allocate COVID-19 vaccine to HRSA-supported health centers.

During the first phase of the program, HRSA invited 250 health centers to participate. To further expand the program and accelerate the delivery of vaccines to medically underserved communities and disproportionately affected populations, HRSA and CDC have invited an additional 700 health centers to participate. These 700 health centers will have the opportunity to join the program over the next 6 weeks, increasing the total number of health center participants to 950.

HRSA-funded health centers are community-based and patient-directed organizations that deliver affordable, accessible, quality, and cost-effective primary health care. Nationwide, nearly 1,400 HRSA-funded health centers operate approximately 13,000 sites, providing primary and preventive care on a sliding fee scale to nearly 30 million patients each year. Over 91% of health center patients are individuals or families living at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines and nearly 63% are racial/ethnic minorities. Health centers across the nation are playing vital roles in supporting local community responses to the COVID-19 public health emergency.

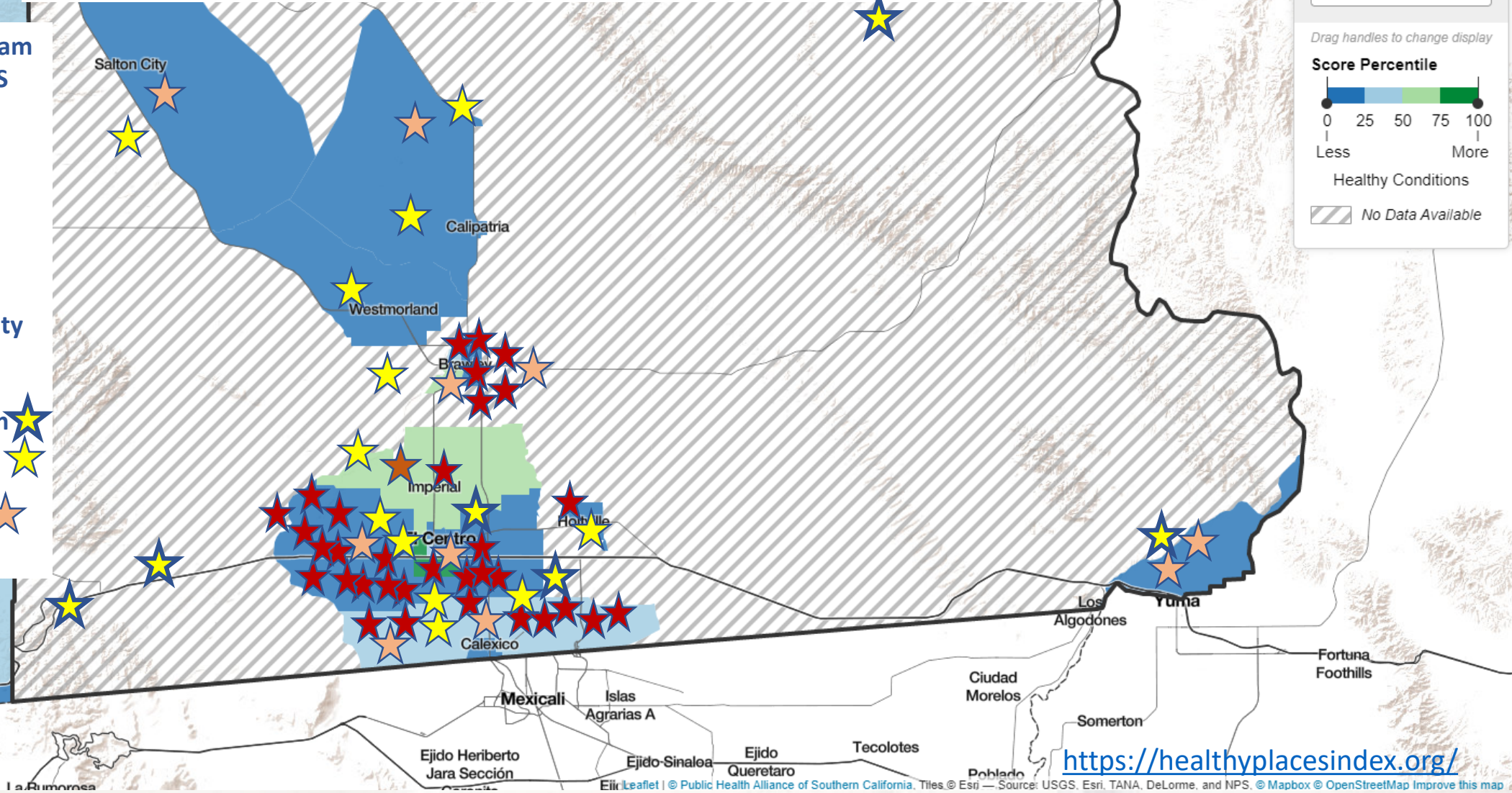

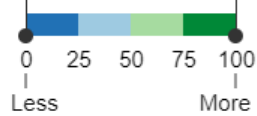


California Healthy Places Index

Census Tracts

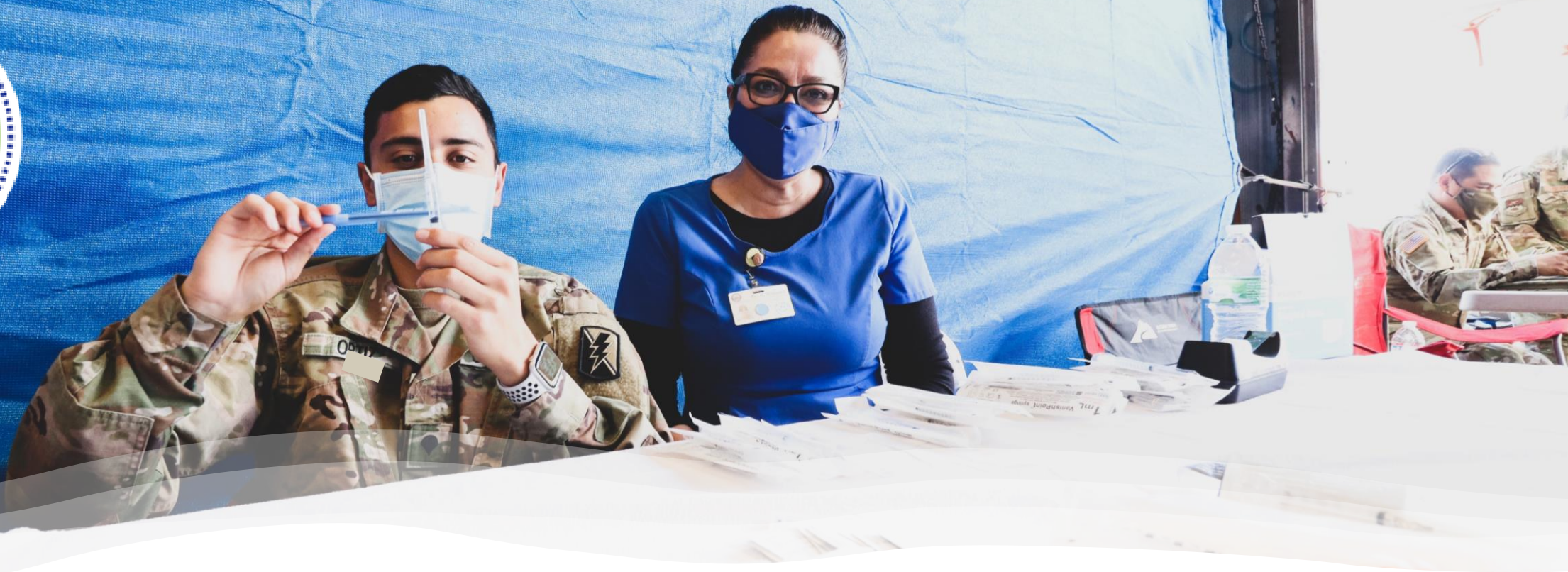

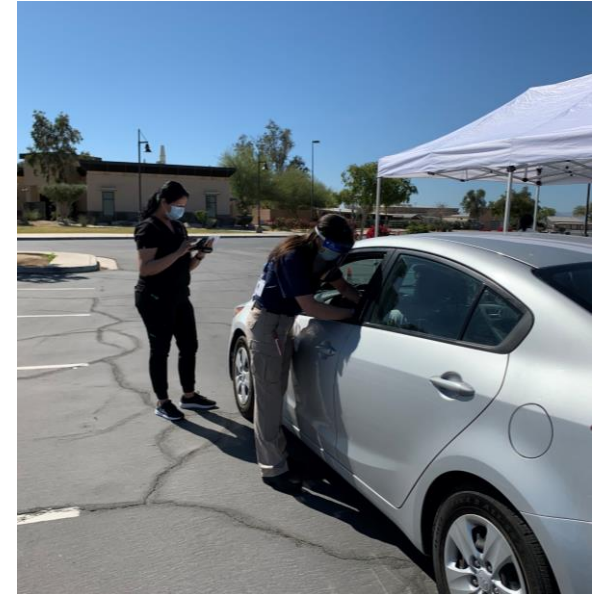

COVID-19 vaccination: Find out if it's your turn

Everyone in California will have an opportunity to get vaccinated against COVID-19 at no cost. But our vaccination supply is limited right now. So we're starting with the groups who are at highest risk, like people with a high chance of exposure and people 65 and older.

Are you eligible?

Find out if it's your turn by answering a few questions. It only takes a few minutes. If you're eligible and vaccine appointments are available through My Turn, you can schedule one. If it's not your turn yet or appointments are not available, you can register to be notified when you're eligible or when appointments open up.

NOTICE: Due to the high demand and limited supply of COVID-19 vaccines, appointments may take a few weeks to schedule. We are adding more appointments regularly and continue to expand statewide.

Other Common Community Questions

When can K-12 in-person instruction begin in Imperial?

Because Imperial County is in the Red Tier, schools may reopen fully for in-person instruction. Local school officials will decide whether and when that will occur. See guidance for [schools](#), [cohorting FAQs](#), and [CA Safe Schools for All hub](#).

What sports are allowed?

Sports are permitted depending on: a) the Tier the jurisdiction is in ([see Table in guidance](#)); b) level of contact participants in the sport have with each other (low, moderate or high); and whether the sport is played indoors or outdoors. Exceptions found in the following sections of the guidance: Play in Less Restrictive Tiers: Outdoor High-Contact Sports; Play in Less Restrictive Tiers: Outdoor Moderate-Contact Sports; and **Conditions for Return to Play if Not Otherwise Authorized**.

Conditions for Return to Play if Not Otherwise Authorized: A team in any sport, including indoor sports, may return to competition and contact practice at any time (i.e., earlier than otherwise authorized by the Guidance), if the team adheres the additional requirements imposed on collegiate sports, as specified in the Institutions of Higher Education Guidance, dated September 30, 2020.

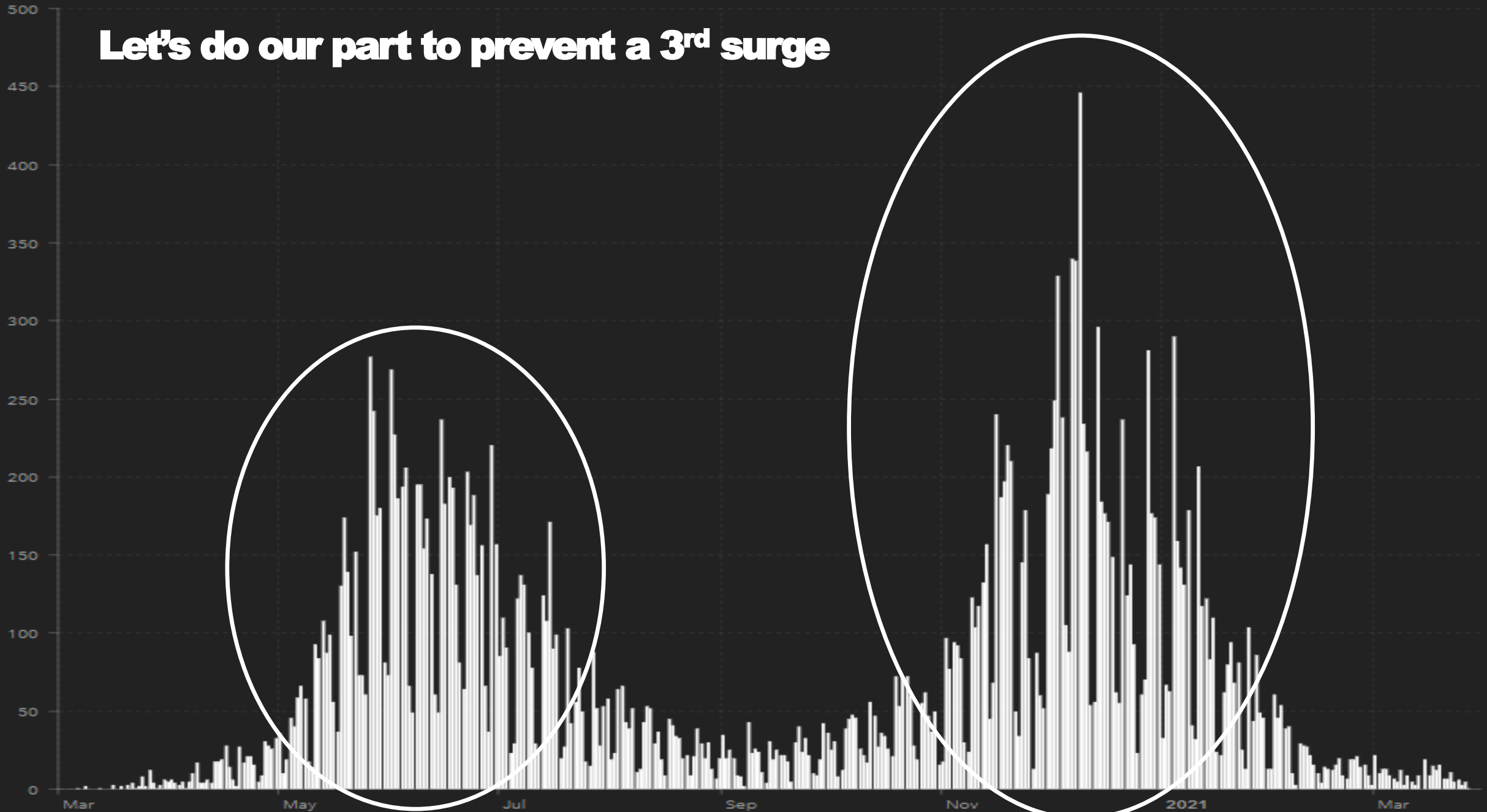
